Angel 'Enhanced'

Secure Vision has recently completed the installation of three of the four stations for Enhance under its contract. Enhance are a joint venture created between Amey and Telnet, who were awarded the contract by Tubelines

to install the communication (SCADA) system upgrades to all of Tubelines stations under the PPP contract. These works include the installation of all communication system peripherals for the station including a full PA/VA system (Speakers, ANS

and rack equipment), CCTV system, SMS and a full Station Control Point with desk. The stations Secure Vision has completed are Mornington Crescent, Finchley Road and Angel.



Tube Lines issued a "Beacon Site" safety award to Angel Station for the excellent Health & Safety record achieved during the installation. Secure Vision was pleased to hand over all sites in time to meet the "Beneficial Use" dates despite the challenging project environment. All at Secure Vision are hoping that the delivery of the 3 stations will secure a long and prosperous relationship with Enhance & Telnet for further works in the future.

Customer Information Systems-Displays Project

Back in 2003, London Underground wanted to replace the old “white boards” that were used to display the level of service on each of the underground lines by way of plastic names plates which carried the names of each line. These were normally positioned at the gate line and gave passengers information regarding the level of service they could expect on each line, i.e. good service – delays -

line closed etc. The new customer information displays (CIDs) would be connected to LUL’s real time intranet and this information would be updated every 30 seconds and displayed on the screens. Secure Vision was successful with the tender and the design element was a fundamental part of our tender submission. Secure Vision produced a number of outline drawings and conceptual designs for different types of housings including post mounted options. The picture shown, is our version 1 pedestal installed at Amersham Station. During the design phase, Secure Vision wanted to exhibit to LUL and Metronet Rail that we had designed the unit with all elements of the environment being considered right through to the installation. When we had the first prototype pedestal manufactured, we hired a conference suite on the 12th floor of the Tower Hotel, Tower Bridge, London, to show that this very heavy steel unit could be maneuvered, in

three pieces, and installed anywhere. This proved that a very large and heavy piece of equipment would also be able to be taken underground and installed within the limited engineering time that all contractors have between traffic hours.

The project has been successfully managed by Metronet Rail. Initially there were going to be 32 displays at 23 stations. This has now been increased to 52 displays at 38 stations. The 40” TFT screen is manufactured by Samsung and the pedestal is manufactured from heavy gauge steel and is powder coated. The unit has been installed on Sub surface stations as well as section 12 stations.

Secure Vision are continuing to install version 2 of the pedestal, and are currently designing additional products to complement our portfolio which includes different screen size and mounting options.

Major Installation for Sussex Police

When Sussex Police required a major installation of a new CCTV system at its main Brighton police station they came to Secure Vision for the solution.

The total project involved installation of CCTV for visual surveillance of both internal and external areas, linked to and controlled by Sussex police's town centre control room. One of the PTZ cameras can be still be seen on the roof of John Street Police Station which has incredible zoom capabilities.

Initially, external cameras were installed to monitor the perimeter of the station, with others being installed within the station compounds, door access areas and reception.

Since securing the original con-

tract Secure Vision has installed two further independent systems within the station. The first was for the new Identity Suite - this installation being featured on BBC South East News.

The system comprised CCTV cameras and an audio system that allowed for simultaneous recording of witness and suspect interviews.

The second system was installed in the new custody suite and included CCTV cameras for controlling all access and egress doors within this area. Additional cameras were also installed in the vulnerable cells.

Quick Checklist

- Do you need to work at height?
- If you do have to work at height, use the most appropriate equipment. Remember, use mobile towers in preference to podium steps and podium steps in preference to steps or ladders.



- Check the equipment, make sure it's functional.
- Do you have a risk assessment for the works?
- Are you implementing all the safety control measures detailed in your method statements?
